WHAT IS PACE?

The Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) is a community-based program that provides coordinated medical and social services to eligible older adults who want to continue living in their own home despite chronic care needs. The PACE team works with each participant to develop a care plan that promotes independence and the highest quality of life while allowing choice and dignity for participants and their families. Most PACE participants are dual-eligible, meaning they qualify for both Medicaid and Medicare although there are also private pay options. PACE is both a health care provider and responsible for managing and paying for all services delivered to participants.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO BECOME A PACE PARTICIPANT?

- Age 55 or over
- Live within the PACE service area (select zip codes in Warren, Washington, Saratoga counties)
- Certified by NYS as meeting the need for nursing home level of care
- Able to live safely in the community with the support of PACE services

WHAT SERVICES DO PACE PARTICIPANTS RECEIVE?

Health care services

- Primary care
- Home care
- Specialty care
- Dental care
- Prescription drug services
- Physical, occupational, speech and respiratory therapies
- Hospital, nursing home, rehabilitation, and palliative care services

Human services

- An adult day program for socialization and therapeutic activities
- Nutrition and meals
- Transportation to Day Center and all medical appointments
- Care management and caregiver support
